



Bonanza Quad & Side-by-Side Bog Rules & Regulations

Rules may change for the betterment of the event.

Bonanza & District Agricultural Society race director Bill Hutchinson reserves the right to make rule changes or decisions as he sees fit to promote fairness in the competition. All decisions made by the director are final.

ATV/UTVs must be either kept in the race grounds until the end of the fair or they must be removed from the property. ABSOLUTLEY NO ATV/UTV'S WILL BE PERMITTED TO TRAVEL AROUND THE GROUNDS WITHOUT A STAFF SIGN. THEY CAN ONLY BE DRIVEN TO RACE!!!

In the event any participant or persons accompanying said participant is observed operating his machine in an unsafe or unsportsmanlike manner, the participant and entire party accompanying participant will be asked to leave Bonanza & District Agricultural Society property. No refunds will be given.

All entrants must register and sign a waiver in advance releasing Bonanza Ag. Society.

RULES

- 1. DOT Approved helmet must be worn during the competition.
- 2. Appropriate footwear MUST be worn; NO open toed sandals or bare feet
- 3. A parent or guardian who will execute the waiver must accompany entrant less than 18 years of age. No one under the age of 16 may participate.
- 4. Cost is \$50 per entrance.
- 5. Once registered there will be no refunds.
- **6.** All ATV/UTVs must have a means of attaching a tow rope to the ATV/UTVS should it become stuck or disabled during the event. Participants are responsible for attaching the tow rope to their own machine.
- 7. NO passengers allowed
- **8.** All ATV/UTVs arriving at the starting line must be ready to race. Work may not be performed on the ATV/UTV in the staging area or on the starting line.
- **9.** Starting line position will be determined by Bonanza Ag. Society and race director. Boundaries of the bog will be marked. Participants who partially leave the course with any portion of their machine will be disqualified.
- 10. The winner of each race will be determined by the ATV/UTV that makes it through the bog in the least amount of time. Distance will be measured from the start line to the front of farthest front tire.
- 11. At least 1 hand and 1 foot must remain on the ATV/UTV at all times during the race. The only time a rider is allowed to dismount the ATV/UTV during the race is if the ATV/UTV is rolling over. The rider is then allowed to catch the ATV/UTV and maintain control. If the rider dismounts and the throttle is pressed they will be disqualified.

- **12**. Participants are not allowed to consume any alcohol, drugs or any contraband substance prior to or during races.
- **13**. All participants must attend the drivers meeting before the event begins.
- 14. ATV/UTV must be in safe mechanical condition to compete.
- **15.** No tires for skimming are allowed in any event.

STOCK CLASS RULES

Tires must be production ATV/UTV tires and size stamped on sidewall Big bore kits, aftermarket exhaust, intake systems and CDI boxes are fine. No large paddles or tracks








Bonanza Mudder Trucker's Mud Bog Challenge Rules & Regulations

RULES

- 1. Helmet must be worn by all drivers.
- 2. Seat belt (restraint) must be worn by all drivers.
- 3. Any vehicle with open top, soft top or with glass removed must have roll cage securely mounted.
- **4.** Each truck entered is allowed maximum 4 pit crew (driver included) on day of event. Pit identification provided at time of naming. Crew must be named at this time.
- 5. No drinking in pit area. Teams are also prohibited from drinking prior to and during events. NO EXCEPTIONS. Violators will be dealt with through disqualification. Team leader is responsible. For example, if 2 vehicles and crews are registered under one name, both sets will be disqualified.
- **6.** Team leader is responsible for pit crew and pit area.
- 7. Front tow hook required for all entrants as vehicles will be towed forward from pit.
- 8. \$5.00 hookup fee per registration
- **9.** First vehicle running a new pit will have the option of running again. Decision must be made immediately after first run and vehicle runs again in position assigned by Mud Boss.
- **10.** Winner shall be decided by best time of 2 runs. All vehicles allowed 2 runs except first through who has option of additional run.
- **11**. Positions for start will be decided in order of registration.
- **12**. Vehicles can only be registered once per class.
- **13.** If under 18, parental consent form must be signed and approved by Mud Boss. Passenger must wear helmet and be 14 and up.
- **14.** All fees are non-refundable.
- **15**. No exhaust pipes shall point to the sides or in a way in which they may throw projectiles towards spectators.
- **16**. All drive shafts in open floor vehicles must have safety cage or loops.
- 17. Starting box consists of a 15 foot area. Front axle can be placed anywhere from first to final line within the box. Timer starts at first movement of axle.
- **18.** Mud Boss to be named prior to event and has final say on all rulings and issues.
- 19. ALL trucks must remain in the race grounds for the remainder of the fair

Bonanza Demolition Derby Rules & Regulations

- This is a spectator's sport!
- Absolutely NO SANBAGGING!! Drivers will only receive 1 WARNING!
- No Alcoholic beverages will be allowed on the premises except in the designated areas. Drivers under the influence of drugs or alcohol will be banned from the premises. The RCMP had indicated that since this is public property they will be on patrol.
- Drivers must be 14 years of age and possess a valid driver's license. Drivers under 18 years old must present written consent from parents prior to the derby.
- All drivers enter the Derby at their own risk and the Wembley Demolition Derby Association is not responsible for any participant injuries.
- Prior to the derby, the Derby Officials will inspect all vehicles. The appointed officials have complete control and their decision is final. Disobeying Derby Officials will result in immediate disqualification and entry to future events.
- Head Tech's decision is final!
- Anyone driving wild or crazy outside of the Derby circle will be disqualified and the entry fee will not be reimbursed.
- Heat numbers will be assigned and shall not be exchanged. To ensure fairness, names for you
 heat will be drawn on Derby day once payment has been made for the cars. Heat winners will
 compete in the championship heat.
- The safety for spectators, officials, drivers and pit crew is our main concern. Fire, flying debris and impact injuries are also a concern so please keep this in mind when building and working on your vehicles.
- The following vehicles are not permitted in the derby, **no exceptions**:

Convertibles

T-tops

Ambulances

Hearses

El Caminos/Rancheros

1973 and older Chrysler Imperials. This includes Imperial sub frames!

No 1970 or older Lincolns

- If there are any discrepancies in your build you will be given ONE opportunity to repair your car. If you are unable to make the requested changes you will be disqualified and your entry will not be refunded!
- Your car cannot be inspected until it is race ready. Do not come if your vehicle is not race ready.
- There will be no welding on any car except where the rules clearly state that it is allowed.
- There will be no reinforcing except where the rules clearly state that it is allowed.
- If it does not say it's allowed than its most likely not.
- We understand there are differences in everyone's builds! And everyone's build are unique in their own way!
- A re-inspection will be done before any car advances, and or any prize money is distributed!
- Head inspection judge can and Will disqualify any car found to have direct rule infractions.

- Clothing long sleeve shirts or jackets or coveralls and long leg pants or coveralls or driving suites are now COMPULSORY while driving – not just recommended.
- Eye Protection Safety glasses or clear plastic visors or shield for helmets, or goggles are now COMPULSORY when driving. (NOTE: keep goggles, helmet, coveralls, or driving uniform in a duffle bag or sports bag for ready use.)
- Drivers must keep head and arms inside and remain seat belted in vehicle until heat is completed
 or otherwise directed by Derby Officials during events
- Drivers compartment padding is strongly recommended!
- Drivers door must be painted white.
- Drivers door hits are illegal, if deemed careless or intentional by officials you may be disqualified. If you use your door as defence then HOLD ON!
- Drivers are advised to pad their steering wheel centers.
- Working brakes are required and will be checked!
- Able vehicles must make a hit within 60 seconds or be disqualified. Dead tie is a max of 60 seconds.
- After passing inspection you will be provided with a breakable stick fixed to your window pillar, breaking the stick means you are out of the heat. No vehicle can be hit once the stick is broken, nor can that vehicle resume action.
- Vehicles to be removed the same day, any left will be scraped.

Mandatory stripping of cars:

- Remove all glass, lights, lenses, mirrors, and hardware.
- Remove all body trim, hub caps, and exterior ornaments.
- Remove fuel tank.
- Remove trailer hitch and all mounting components.
- Remove complete interior with exception of the front seat.
- Your car must be clean of all debris and loose objects, including in the trunk area.

Door and Door Reinforcements:

- We allow almost a cage built around the driver from sturdy, easily assembled material.
- Interior or exterior door bars are accepted. If the door bar falls off during the derby you will be disqualified.
- Driver doors must be and passenger doors may be reinforced with channel iron, I beam, or box steel. No grader blades!
- 2" x 6" is min, 12" max width, 76" max length.
- Exterior bars must be beveled.
- Exterior bars must bolt through entire door or post, not just outer skin.
- Front dash bar and rear cross bars are mandatory, Max size is 6"
- Dash bar may have 2 down bars bolted to floor pan.
- Interior cage will be bolted in place, interior side bars may not extend past front cross bar and only 6" past rear cross bar.
- Outer door bars may extend 8" past fender seam
- If running outer door bars, hard top cars may also run a Max 10" inner door bar on pass side.
- Hard top cars may add bar to act as a b-pillar.

- Floor to roof type head bars are mandatory. You may run 2 of these. Halo bars are acceptable but must only attach to cage or floor.
- Gas tank protectors are allowed but must be attached to rear cross bar only. Min 4" off of floor and Min 4" from rear seat, Max width 24".
- All doors must be securely fastened shut by means of bolts, chains, clamps, etc.
- A sturdy metal headrest must be installed in all vehicles. Either door post to door
 post or floor to roof types are acceptable. Headrest must be volted to top of the
 cross brace. Post to post types must be below the top of the front seat and
 headrest pad must be flat, padded and have a min area of 8 sq inches. If the
 headrest is mounted behind the seat, a spacer must be used to place the pad
 directly behind the driver's helmet.
- Doors may be welded shut 6" weld, 6" no weld. Filler may be 2"x3/16 flat bar or 1/2" round bar.

Engine:

- Any engine may be used in any car but must mount within 3" of original mounts.
- · Headers or exhaust manifold are mandatory.
- Mounting of engine must not strengthen the car in any way.
- Engine mounts must be independent of each other.
- No engine cradles.
- Mounts may be welded into the car and you may add light bracing but engine must be bolted to the mount.
- You may chain the engine down.
- · You must run an air cleaner.
- No skid plates.
- No starting fluids allowed.

Transmission:

- You may use any type of mounts.
- If not using a factory cross member you may use 2" x 2" square tubing.
- Any type of coolers is acceptable but must be securely fastened in pass compartment. A hole will be cut in the floor under the cooler for a drain.
- 3/4 hose attached to fill tube is required.
- Metal or braided lines must be used, or High-pressure fuel hose allowed.
- Any type of shifter may be used but must not strengthen car in any way.
- It if is deemed that you are using a kicker it will be removed, or you will cut the firewall and floor out!!
- Any type of driveshaft is acceptable.

Rear Differential:

- Dif swaps are allowed but must use stock mounting brackets.
- You may weld stock brackets to housing if doing a swap.
- No added bracing allowed.
- Must be of passenger car origin, 5 lug max.
- You may lengthen or shorten trailing arms but no reinforcing.

Rear Suspension:

- 10 leaf max, must have stagger.
- 3/8 max thickness, 1 1/2 max width.

- Electric pumps must have a clearly marked shut off switch.
- All fuel lines passing through any panels must be protected.
- Tank must not reinforce the car.

Tires & Brakes:

- You may run any type of air-filled tire.
- Max tire size is 16".
- Flapper (double side wall) tires are allowed.
- No split rims, studded tires, solid or filled tires allowed.
- No home-made rims allowed.
- Valve stem protectors are permitted.
- All wheel weights must be removed.
- Any type of braking system or configuration is allowed.
- If using a pinion brake the mounting must only be to mount caliper and not to strengthen housing.
- If using floor mounted pedals, they must not strengthen car ar all or will be cut.
- Any size wheel nuts are allowed.

Batteries:

- You may run a max of 1 12 Volt batteries.
- Must be securely fastened in front of the pass seat/floor.
- Unless gel batteries you must cover them.
- Must be in a secure battery box, no milk crates.
- Box must not reinforce the car.

Hood & Trunk:

- Hoods are mandatory.
- Must have hold in hood to extinguish a fire.
- Must be bolted, chained, fastened in up to 6 places.
- Max washer size is 6" x 6".
- 2 of the 6 may attach to the frame through original body mount.
- Max redi-rod size is 1 1/4"
- You may use 2 pcs of 2" x 2" angle iron 6" long welded to body & hood or trunk then bolted together with 2 bolts. Max 3/8 in size.
- You may use 20 bolts, 3/8 max in size to bolt hood skins together.
- You may tuck, or canoe trunk but light panel must remain vertical.
- Trunk lid may be inverted.
- Trunk may be welded with 6" of weld with 2" 3/16 flat bar as filler but will count as one of your 6 spots.

Body:

- All body mounts must remain intact except where all tread passed through.
- Any body bolts that are replace must remain factory size.
- Wheel wells may be trimmed.
- Firewall may be cut out.
- Any creasing of body is allowed.
- 8 bolts per wheel well are allowed. Max size 1/2"
- Doors may be welded 6" weld 6" no weld.
- Rotted out floors may be replaced with same thickness material and tacked in place.
- 2 front window bars are allowed.
- 1 rear window bar is allowed, roof to speaker deck only.
- Side windows may have 1 bar per.
- Hard tops may have 2 side window bars.






